



ODD NUMBERS AND EVEN NUMBERS:

EVEN NUMBERS: An even number is any number that is divisible by 2.

For example: 12 is divisible by 2. So, 12 is even.

The numbers with **0,2,4,6 or 8** in the ones place are even numbers.

Like 12, 64, 28, 46, 642, 170, etc are even numbers.

ODD NUMBERS: An odd number is any number that is not divisible by 2.

For example: 15 is not divisible by 2. So, 15 is odd.

The numbers with **1,3,5,7 or 9** in the ones place are odd numbers.

Like 37, 129, 41, 65, 113, etc are odd numbers.

Even numbers end in 0 2 4 6 8 Examples: 4,56,730,etc.	Odd numbers end in 1 3 5 7 9 Examples: 9,83,647, etc.
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

Successor and Predecessor

The successor of a whole number is the number obtained by adding 1 to it.

i.e, the successor of 0 is 1,

the successor of 1 is 2,

the successor of 2 is 3 and so on.

The predecessor of a whole number is one less than the given number.

i.e, the predecessor of 1 is 0,

the predecessor of 2 is 1,

the predecessor of 3 is 2 and so on.

[NOTE:

The whole number 0 does not have any whole number as its predecessor.]

COMMON NAMES AND SPECIAL NAMES

COMMON NAMES

- Names that are given to any place, person, animal or thing in general are called common names.
- Common names do not begin with a capital letter.
- For eg: boy, girl, park, book, crow, box, tiger, etc.

SPECIAL NAMES

- A particular name given to a person, place, pet or a thing and also the name of a book, month, day, river, street, building, monument is called a special name.
- Special names always begin with a capital letter.
- For eg: Little Star High School, Reena, Shimla, The National Park, Harry Potter, Tommy, etc.
